November 22, 1963 - John Fitzgerald Kennedy, the 35th President of the United States, was assassinated while riding in a motorcade in Dallas, Texas. Texas Governor John B. Connally, in the same car as Kennedy, was seriously wounded. A suspect, Lee Harvey Oswald was arrested. Vice President Lyndon B. Johnson was sworn in as President.

November 23, 1936 - Life, the photo-journalism magazine created by Henry R. Luce, was first published!

THE BERLIN CONCERT BAND, UNDER THE LEADERSHIP OF CAPT. DON M. KIMBLE OF THE FAMOUS 164TH REGIMENT BAND, WILL FURNISH MUSIC DURING THE DAY. THE J. R. O. U. A. M. DRUM CORPS WILL ALSO FURNISH MUSIC ON THE OCCASION.

TWO BALL GAMES

A GAME OF BASE BALL BETWEEN THE BERLIN AND MEYERSDALE FIREMEN WILL BE PLAYED AT THE BERLIN ATHLETIC FIELD AT 3:00 O'CLOCK. AT 5:30 IN THE EVENING A GAME WILL BE PLAYED BETWEEN THE REGULAR BERLIN TEAM AND A STRONG VISITING CLUB.

AMUSEMENTS

OF ALL KINDS FOR YOUNG AND OLD WILL BE PROVIDED AT THE GROVE, INCLUDING ATHLETIC CONTESTS, RACES, GAMES, ETC. THERE WILL NOT BE ONE DOLLAR DURING THE PICNIC.

SEVERAL STANDS WILL BE AMPLY SUPPLIED TO SUIT ALL. HOT DINNERS WILL BE SERVED TO THOSE WHO DO NOT CARE TO BRING A BASKET. SANDWICHES, CAKE, PIES, ICE CREAM AND SOFT DRINKS WILL BE FOR SALE.

Street Carnival at Night

This is planned to be one of the big features of the celebration. There will be booths and stands of every description in and about the Lower Square, while the attractions will embrace a Side Show, Museum, Old '49 Dance Hall, Real Colored Minstrel Show, Fortune Teller, and everything that goes to make a carnival attraction, even the "Hot Dog" Stand and Cane Rack. These are all "local talent," and intended to provide fun and amusement for young and old.

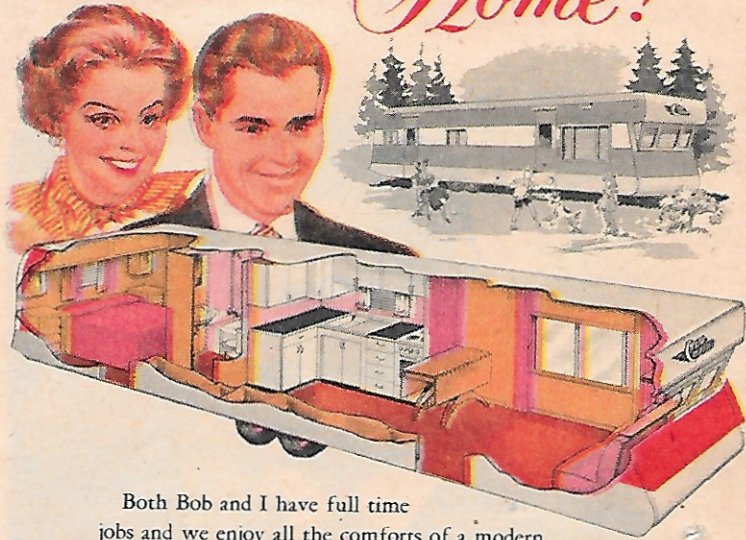

Clayton Moore, 85, television's "Lone Ranger", died in West Hills, California.

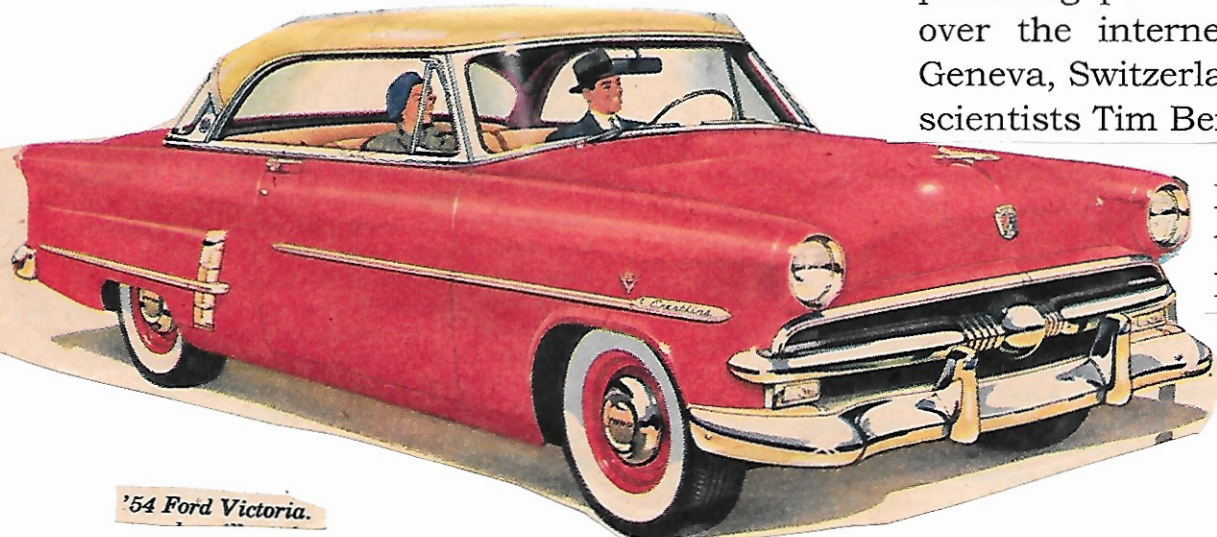
DECEMBER 28, 1945 -
