This bill was issued on December 15, 1902 by E. E. Boger to his first cousinonce removed James Madison Shober of the Shober family farm at Beachdale. Fred E. A 1902 POSTMARK FOR HAY'S MILL – A RARE GEM!






e are indebted to Fred E. Bittner for allowing BAHS to copy the above envelope addressed to (James) Madison Shober at the Shober family farm near Beachdale. The envelope carries the postmark of Hay's Mill. The post office operated out of the second floor of the Hay's Mill gristmill while it was owned and operated by Jacob Becker and his son, George Becker.

The Hay's Mill Post Office closed in the early years of the 1900s. Meyersdale Post Office absorbed the patrons in Hay's Mill and the surrounding area. Alphonso "Allen" Boger, a nephew of Ephraim E. Boger, was the first rural carrier for Hay's Mill using a horse as he made his rounds to the patrons' homes. Ephraim E. Boger, a farmer and farm implement dealer, bought the grist mill from the Becker family about 1915 and was assisted by his sons, Baden and Homer P. Boger in its operations for a small clientele of neighbors and friends.

In the 1940's after Homer P. and Sadie Boger acquired the farm and the "idle" grist mill, Home dismantled the structure because it would have required much expense to restore the roof on a large structure that really wasn't needed in the community. For some decades, Homer S. Boger (son of Homer P. Boger) owned and restored the cubby holes of the Hay's Mill post office, which was displayed in his Meyersdale home. In more recent years the former Hay's Mill postal case passed to another generation of the Boger family.

Ephraim E. Boger was a first cousin of Mrs. George Washington (Leah Berkley) Shober, who was the mother of (James) Madison Shober of Beachdale.

THE SARVER CHURCH IN ALLEGHENY TOWNSHIP



his picture of the Sarver Church in Allegheny Township was donated by Craig J. Cameron of Altoona. Jon Evans of Perry Hall, MD has contributed this information on the church's history, being a grandson of Rev. Evans: "Upon graduation from Moody Bible Institute in 1924, the Rev. Charles Wesley Evans conducted worship and preached at Sarver Church until moving to Hyndman in November 1927. Thereafter Rev. Evans was at Fairhope, Comps, and Kennells Mill in Somerset County."

The Sarver Church was once part of the Evangelical and United Brethren denomination and later became the Sarver Community Church. It has been a family owned cabin and in recent times has returned to being the Sarver Community Church. Some remember when the Rev. Leonard Day was serving as pastor. The Berlin Area Historical Society would be happy for additional history of this historical house of worship.

The above four carvings of the Berlin Fife & Drum Corps were donated by Sara (Croner) Atkinson and her husband Ackie during the weekend Sara returned to Berlin for her 60th graduation class reunion. The carvings represent the work of woodcarver David P. Castano of Coudersport (Columbia Carvings). Dave's wife, Judy is the daughter of Joseph and Nina (Conn) Mack, who were both natives of the Macdonaldton area. Also in Sara's donated collection were the following bottles: Modern Dairy; Berlin Bottling Works; Soda Water, Berlin; a Berlin coke bottle, and a Ken Lafferty Chevrolet key chain. There were also ink wells from the Berlin schools and a butter patty dish from Shockey's Hotel. Sara's mother, Dorothy (Hay) Croner-Suder was 99 years of age at the time of Sara and Ackie's visit.

Dahl's Hotel operated for a short time on Main Street where Shockey's Hotel, Lishia's Hotel, and Hunter's Inn were also located. George and Carolyn Custer donated Lambert family genealogy charts and three American White Cross gauze bandages.
