

On November 3, 2025, the above named family of the late Walter W. and Agnes (Raygor) Athey, long-time residents of the Berlin area, visited the Berlin Area Historical Society. They enjoyed the interesting display of Surge items and a personal photo album that shares details of the many years that Walter Winfield Athey served as a Surge dealer and serviceman to many farm families living in the Berlin area and many surrounding communities.

Many farm folks depended upon Walter for new Surge equipment and dependable maintenance when they were having trouble with their equipment. He was known far and wide for his business ventures. His son, Rick assisted in the business while growing up. As he perused the photo and memorabilia album he easily named the various models and years of the trucks that were used by the Athey dealership. Kathy Picking, a daughter, recalled that when her parents, Walter and Agnes Athey, re-located to the Berlin area, they had five children with little money for a down payment on buying a home. A local farmer provided money so they could purchase their home along the Brotherton Road in Brothersvalley Township. The Athey children included Annie Lee Baker, Dorothy Shultz, Nancy Barkman, Kathleen Picking, and Richard Athey.
